The business community is in unprecedented territory. The Chamber is working with the National Chamber network, Whanganui & Partners, the Ministry of Social Development and the Whanganui DHB to provide the best support to its members, other businesses and the community.

We have cancelled all Chamber of Commerce events until the middle of April. We will continue to be informed by Government recommendations and follow best practice guidelines. In the meantime, we are investigating options to communicate and share information via 'virtual' events. We will keep you updated.

The \$12.1 billion economic development package announced by the Government to help cushion the impact of COVID-19 and support the economy through this difficult time, can be viewed here.

This package is unparalleled and we encourage you to take a look at what it includes and whether your business is eligible or not. The support package will be administered by the Ministry of Social Development and in the first instance, you will need to complete a simple online application form.

There are two payments available to support employers affected by COVID-19:

COVID-19 Wage Subsidy

The Government has put together a COVID-19 Wage Subsidy for employers in all regions. It's to support your business if you are impacted by COVID-19 and face laying off staff or reducing their hours because of COVID-19.

COVID-19 Leave Payment

Self-isolation is an important way to slow the spread of COVID-19. The COVID-19 Leave Payment is available to support people financially if they need to self-isolate. It will be paid to employers to pass onto their employees who need to self-isolate for 14 days, based on Ministry of Health guidelines.
